<b>REASON FOR CHANGE</b>					
<b>RATIONALE &amp; PROCESS</b>					
<p>This form is used for students to request a subject change during the school year. Students have the first four weeks of Term 1 to change subjects. After this, there will need to be an acceptable reason for a subject change to occur. In Years 11 and 12, it is recommended that students remain in the same subjects as much as possible, in order to meet tertiary entry requirements.</p> <p>Most subjects in Years 11 &amp; 12 build in complexity over the 2-year course, and therefore changing mid-year can be very challenging. For that reason, if students wish to change subjects they need to follow the following process:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Discuss their desire to leave the current subject with their teacher.</li> <li>• Discuss their desire to join a new subject with the teacher of that subject.</li> <li>• Make an appointment to see the Head of Secondary to discuss the change.</li> <li>• Have this form signed by a parent or carer, with the proposed change clearly marked, and a brief description of the reason for changing.</li> </ul> <p>Please note that there are class size restrictions which could prevent the desired change. There are also subjects in which changing mid-year is very challenging, and others which have additional requirements that may need to be fulfilled before a change can take place.</p> <p>Students considering more than one of the green shaded options need to be aware that the government's VET in Schools funding will usually only apply to a student's first course, and that the student is therefore likely to pay a fee-for-service for the second.</p> <p>Students who desire to change into any of the orange shaded options will need to complete Safety Training before being able to participate in practical activities.</p>

<b>Hospitality &amp; Kitchen Operations</b>	<p>Hospitality and Kitchen Operations will be run as a combined class. Students will be required to participate in after-hours activities. Hospitality students will be working towards a Certificate II in Hospitality SIT20316; Kitchen Operations students will be working towards a Certificate II in Kitchen Operations SIT20416, both of which are offered in conjunction with TAFE Queensland. As this is competency-based assessment, students' assessment in Hospitality and Kitchen Operations will not count towards their GPA. Students are unable to undertake both Hospitality and Kitchen Operations.</p>				
<b>Computer Studies</b>	<p>Students who select Computer Studies will receive certification from the relevant agency upon successful completion of each course. Because students are assessed by external agencies, and not TCC, their assessment in Computers will not count towards their GPA.</p>				
<b>Baking</b>	<p>Baking students will be required to participate in after-hours activities. Baking students will be working towards a Certificate II in Retail Baking Assistance FDF20510, which is offered in conjunction with TAFE Queensland. As this is competency-based assessment, students' assessment in Baking will not count towards their GPA.</p>				
<b>Physics</b>	<p>Physics students must also be studying Mathematical Methods. To recognise the complexities of Physics, an increase of a grade of 1 will be added to students' semester results for the purposes of GPA calculation only.</p>				
<b>Chemistry</b>	<p>Students selecting Chemistry must achieve at least a C+ in Year 10 Science. It is preferable that Chemistry students are also studying Mathematical Methods. To recognise the complexities of Chemistry, an increase of a grade of 1 will be added to students' semester results for the purposes of GPA calculation only.</p>				
<b>Externally Delivered Elective (EDE)</b>	<p>Externally Delivered Electives should be discussed with Mr Glyn Reinbott, the Career's Officer, before selecting.
